Leicestershire Police graded as 'outstanding' following inspection report

The national inspection body for policing, Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabulary and Fire & Rescue Services (HMICFRS) has released a glowing report of Leicestershire Police following a comprehensive inspection.

Rated '**outstanding**' in three key areas, Leicestershire Police stands out from the crowd with the force's work acknowledged as innovative. Her Majesty's Inspector has congratulated Leicestershire Police for an outstanding performance particularly in a challenging policing environment.

The report gives an outstanding rating in areas of prevention and deterrence, protecting vulnerable people and recording crime. Four other areas were rated as good and two as adequate. This means that all of Leicestershire Police's performance is in the top three categories.

The report noted the force has a focus on problem solving and early intervention. It stated that the inspectors found good examples of the force working in a public health approach, in partnership, to divert people away from offending and to safeguard vulnerable people.

It said: "Leicestershire Police demonstrated 'effective community engagement methods by increasingly diverse staff; that help to build trust so that the public will share intelligence or become volunteers to help to reduce crime. Its trailblazing approach to safeguarding the most vulnerable, in particular; by its approach to increasing information sharing to safeguard more children; and introducing work to reduce the threat posed by the most dangerous people."

Temporary Chief Constable Rob Nixon said: "I am proud of what we have achieved and am delighted that we reached an outstanding level in three areas. "This report is good news for our local communities because it shows we do a very good job and that they can have confidence in policing.

"The last two years have been particularly challenging and throughout all of this it is good to see that the Inspectors have acknowledged how well the force has performed. "This success is the result of a team effort and can be attributed to the hard work of our officers and staff across the entire force. I know our former chief constable Simon Cole would have been equally proud.

Moving on to pastures new – This month we said good bye to Sgt Jess Harper who has moved to a different department within the organisation we wish her all the best for the future. Her replacement will be announced in due course and will feature in a future newsletter.

CRIME UPDATES - #YouSaidWeDid -Please find below updates from your local beat team in relation to the priorities you have raised via Neighbourhood Link:

You Said – Anti-Social Behaviour

We Did – Following a number of anti-social behaviour incidents over the last month in Leicester Forest East a group of young people and been spoken to and advice letters given to them. Safe to say parents/guardian were not pleased with further sanctions issued by them.

You Said – Vehicle Crime

We Did – Over the last month we have seen a quite a few reports of number plates being stolen from across the beat and wider area. If your number plates are stolen please report it to us and also inform the DVLA as they maybe used to commit further crime. You can increase your security by using security screws to attach your number. These can be purchased from a wide range of shops and the internet.

You Said – Residential Burglary

We Did – PC Neal and PCSO Loades have been altering their shifts over the last month working into the early hours conducting high visibility patrols across the beat focusing on burglary. Summer is approaching fast and you may have booked your holidays think about your house security before you go away. Let a trusted neighbour or friend know you are going. Ensure all valuables are locked away securely and set your house alarm.
