Positive Outcomes from Crime

We still continue to see a reduction of Burglary and Burglary other than Dwelling reports on the beat, in addition to an overall reduction of recorded incidents for the month.

Emerging Crime Trends

Theft from motor vehicle again still seems to be an emerging trend on the beat with many reports of work vans being targeted by forcing doors and tools being taken. However most of the reports are from vehicles that have been left insecure with items being taken including Golf Clubs, Sat Navs and iPods. Please ensure that you are taking all of our belongings and tools out of your vehicles overnight. We have had two Robbery reported to us over the past month, with one involving a gold chain snatch on Forest Park, Leicester Forest East. This is a crime trend that we have seen emerge on the city which could be now spilling out onto the county/ city boundaries. Please ensure that you are extra vigilant during the hours of darkness, and report any suspicious activity.

Anti-Social Behavior

There have been 34 reports of ASB over the past month, this is a significant increase compared to last month.

It has come to the attention of the team that there has been an increase in ASB related incidents around the David Wilson Estate, Leicester Forest East, involving



groups of youths. As a result of this we have created a Problem Solving Plan which will allow us to focus on this area in an attempt to reduce the issues that have been identified by implementing various schemes/patrols, working closely with our partner agencies. As a result we have secured the BB19 bus which is a youth bus which is now to park up on Kings Walk/ Forest Park area every Friday between 06:30 and 08:30pm. The BB19 bus is a council run scheme which offers facilities for young persons to use. For more information please visit the Facebook page.
