



POLICE REPORT – AUGUST 2017

In August we received 396 calls from members of the public relating to incidents across the three parishes.

Crime Alert

August saw Glenfield subject to 11 burglaries with a further 5 breaks into sheds and garages, with Kirby Muxloe having 6 and LFE 3. We would like to remind the public to be vigilant to suspicious behavior and report any to us directly at the time. Being security conscious is the smart choice and we encourage you take appropriate precautions to reduce the possibility of becoming a victim of crime.

April also saw Glenfield have 6 vehicle related crimes reported to us. Kirby Muxloe also had 2 with LFE having 5.

Glenfield also had a robbery in the vicinity of the Dominion Road/Tournament Road junction.

Anti-Social Behaviour

Neighbour disputes have remained the main focus of the beat teams attention this month with several being investigated. Where possible residents should seek to amicably resolve a problem, however, if communication breaks down to a point whereby the problem is persisting and causing people harassment alarm or distress then we are here to assist by mediating between parties to come to a resolution to ongoing problems. Please don't suffer in silence, let us know about it so we can assist in resolving the matter.

A report of Antisocial Behaviour from persons outside the Forest House Lane shop in Leicester Forest East is currently being investigated. Individuals had been causing the shopkeeper there some problems. If you notice anything untoward at this location please contact us as soon as possible so we can ensure that any misbehaviour in this area is dealt with as effectively as possible.

The old Scrapyard on Barrows Lane has been receiving some attention from local youths. Entry has been gained on multiple occasions and fires lit. Blaby District Council have been informed and efforts are being made to secure the site until a new owner comes forward. The debris has also been brought to the attention of the Environment Department and they are looking into the possibility to removing the problems.
