

Glenfield Newsletter - December 2012

The burglaries have maintained a stubborn level above the average monthly level. The anti-burglary operation that includes extra foot patrols and unmarked patrols continue. We still continue to advise residents to make access to the rear of properties difficult by shutting gates, and locking them. Also continued advice is given to have lights set on timers to come on around the hours of darkness.

There were a spate of shed breaks in and around the Tysoe Hill area over one night in late November whereby a number of adjoining properties had there sheds entered and items taken.

Thefts from motor vehicles are still a problem and villains continue to try vehicle doors in the hope that vehicles are being left unlocked. This does encourage them to come into the area and try doors.

With the first real frosts of the winter upon us it is still evident that people are leaving their cars running to de-frost whilst going inside to keep warm. Three vehicles were taken in this way on the morning of the first real frost last week within the Blaby district. One of those was in Glenfield. On a note of warning: - A lady was locked out of her car when she was de-icing it with the engine running. She went to get in to it and found it had locked all doors and the boot, leaving her stranded. Her hand bag, phone and house keys were in the car. The AA was called for her to assist in entering the vehicle!
