## News

### Glenwatch

The beat team attended the Glenwatch quarterly meeting and addressed matters raised by the attendees. The Damage caused to residents fences being a main point of discussion. Although these occurrences of widespread damage are difficult to police they are thankfully rare. Advice was given as to how the residents may approach the County Council to try and prevent this in the future through target hardening.

Further discussions between the Glenwatch Committee and PCSO Wright brought about some good ideas about how Glenwatch can further benefit the community. We look forward to assisting Glenwatch in its aims.

### M1 J21 Services

The beat team have been working in partnership with the Services Management to reduce the theft from the lorries that occurs at the location. This type of crime is a national issue that we have been liaising with other law enforcement agencies about and have taken action on in December. Several individuals have been Stopped and Searched and offences dealt with accordingly. This enforcement will continue over the coming months.

### Vulnerable People in Your Community

We are currently managing a report of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) between vulnerable people in Glenfield. Working with Social Housing Authorities we are progressing the complaints and continue to strive to manage the situation as best as possible. Whilst this is time consuming work the effect it has on those suffering from ASB can be considerable. If you are aware of any issues in your area, let us know so we can assist.

We are also liaising with a care agency regarding an address in Leicester Forest East. A service user has recently started calling the Police on a regular basis. We are now working with them to try and manage this to reduce the demand on our call takers. Do you know anyone who may need our help? We can assess any concerns and where necessary refer individuals to the relevant authorities to receive appropriate care.

### Damage Caused in Glenfield

As discussed in the Glenwatch Meeting, concerns were raised about this issue. It was individuals causing general destruction to garden fences on this occasion. The only way to prevent this kind of vandalism is to have as sturdy fencing as possible. Unfortunately this is costly and should the vandals be determined enough, even this will not prevent the damage. It will however, deter most random acts. Advice was given about how to try and approach the County Council with a view to closing off part of Cooks Walk as it is no longer used for its original purpose. ## Crime Prevention

### Clare's Law

Individuals have been given the right to find out whether a new partner has been a domestic abuse offender in the past.

The provision gives people in a new relationship, or their friends or relatives, the right to ask police whether a new partner has a record of committing domestic abuse with previous partners. Leicestershire Police will then decide whether a disclosure needs to be made. Any disclosure may be to a different person to the one who submitted the request and it will be to a person who is in the best position to safeguard anyone who is vulnerable.

The scheme has similarities to the Child Sexual Offender Disclosure Scheme, which since 2010 has allowed families to find out if anyone in their children's lives has a conviction for child sex offences.
