In your community...

The beat team were in the beat bus outside Tesco on Dominion Road and the COOP, Braunstone Crossroads in February for local residents to come and meet a member of their beat and speak about any local issues. We'll be out again in March too:

- 12/03/19, 1700-1900, Onestop, Main Street, Kirby Muxloe
- 27/03/19, 0830-1030, Shopping Parade, Faire Road, Glenfield

We attended the quarterly Glenwatch meeting which was very well attended with approximately 50 residents there. Whilst the main focus was on street lighting where it was resolved that Glenwatch will approach the County Council on the matter, many other questions were asked across a variety of topics. This allowed us to offer crime prevention advice to a significant number of people and encourage our details to be passed on to those that weren't in attendance where appropriate so that advice can be given.

What you told us:

- The female begging in Glenfield has continued to keep the beat team engaged in the investigation.
- Laughing Gas canisters reported being left in areas across all areas of the beat.

What we did:

- We hope to provide an update for this issue in the next edition but currently it remains an ongoing investigation.
- Whilst we will deal with any offences linked to this that we come across on our patrols, new legislation means the registered keepers can be fined for vehicles identified in a littering offence. Previously the person responsible for throwing the litter from the vehicle had to be identified for a fine to be issued. Members of the public who witness littering from a vehicle and any other crime of this nature can report it to Blaby Councils Environmental Health team, who will investigate and take the appropriate action where possible."

Vehicle crime is unfortunately a constant blight in our communities. Unfortunately a large percentage of vehicle crime occurs because opportunists are being given an easy time by members of the public not locking their vehicles.

Here are a few further tips to consider when thinking about vehicle security:

- Leave it on show expect it to go. Always remove valuables from your vehicle
- Remove Satnavs including cradles and their sucker marks
- Don't leave tools in vans overnight
