News

Memorial Hall Car Park Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

There has been some young drivers and their passengers visiting and misusing the location reported to us by the Parish Council. Blaby District Council have been informed by the Parish Council about the litter originating from certain cars and the drivers can expect a fine to be heading their way in due course. The beat team will also be in touch with the drivers to issue 1st stage ASB warnings about the other behaviour reported to us being exhibited which other users of the area are likely to be intimidated by.

Damage to Business Premises on Baines Lane

We have been having reports come into us about repeated visits from local youths to the buildings behind The Grange bakery. Damage has been caused and ASB being reported. The beat team are actively patrolling this location and would like to draw parent's attention to this issue.

Proactive Patrols leads to Arrests

The beat team were on patrol on Barrows Lane and found 5 persons with a vehicle. The individuals ran off prompting a pursuit with 2 being detained by a Police Dog. A search of the vehicle they were in uncovered evidence of criminal activity and 2 arrests were made for 'going equipped'. Forensic enquiries are now ongoing to try and identify other suspects.

Special Constables catch Drug Dealer in Kirby Muxloe

After pulling over a vehicle driving through the village for the manner of its driving, a search of the vehicle uncovers evidence of drug dealing. The driver is arrested with for Possession With Intent To Supply (PWITS) and Drug Driving. More good work in the community by our Volunteer Police Officers!

Community Consultation

Drugs Warrant Enforced

Last month we had received intelligence from the community which enabled us to get a warrant for an address. That has resulted in a good result. The beat team executed a drugs warrant with the Hinckley and Blaby Neighbourhood Proactive Team on the new Glenfield Park Estate in early February, locating evidence of the production of drugs. Two individuals have been arrested and questioned who have been released under investigation. We will be informing the social housing authority regarding this as it is a breach of tenancy agreement and they may take further action in relation to this. The investigation is currently ongoing. This is a good example of the result we can achieve when the community works with the police and provides us with the information we need to get a warrant and stop this type of criminality.

School Parents Evenings

The beat team will be attending Fossebrook Primary School on 31st March and the 1st April as well as Stafford Leys Primary School on the 3rd and 5th March. We'll be there to hear any concerns you have around the Parish. Unfortunately we will no longer be able to attend Kirby Muxloe Primary Schools Parents Evening due to operational commitments elsewhere.

Crime Prevention

Crime Prevention – Computer Fraud

Fraudsters posing to be from legitimate companies such as Microsoft or your Internet Service Provider claim they will fix your computer for a fee. Cold Calls or fraudulent websites, pop ups and adverts to get you to call them will result in them trying to remotely access your computer so they can obtain your financial details.

How to protect yourself

- Never reveal your personal or financial details as a result of a cold call
- Never install any software or visit a website as a result of a cold call
- Need professional technical support? ask friends or family for recommendations
