Street Safe - [StreetSafe | Leicestershire Police \(leics.police.uk\)](#)

As part of the government's agenda to tackle violence against women and girls, we are trialling a new online tool called **StreetSafe** to enable people to report locations where they feel or have felt unsafe and to identify the features on why that location made them feel unsafe – For example, because of environmental issues, eg street lighting, abandoned buildings or vandalism and/or because of some behaviours, eg being followed or verbally abused.

StreetSafe is **anonymous**. There will be no questions about your identity, such as your name or date of birth. However, there are optional questions about crime reporting as well as your age, sex, gender, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, illnesses or disabilities. We are asking for this information because it helps us to have a better understanding of your concerns, but you don't have to answer if you don't want to.

Please note: **StreetSafe** is not for reporting crime or incidents. If something has happened to you or someone you know (including in public spaces online) you can call us on **101** or [report online](#).

The Police and Crime Commissioner is launching a new campaign to change men's behaviour towards women and improve women's safety. It calls upon men to challenge the inappropriate behaviour of their friends. Just seen a mate catcall a woman? Not leave her alone when she's said no? Insult

her when she's turned him down? When behaviour towards women crosses the line, you know it's wrong. Start by having a conversation:

Be direct: If safe to do so, call out your mate's behaviour – tell them it's not okay

Get help: Seek help from other friends to challenge the behaviour

Distract: Change the conversation, move away from the situation

CRIME UPDATES - #YouSaidWeDid -Please find below updates from your local beat team in relation to the priorities you have raised via Neighbourhood Link:

You Said – Anti-Social Behaviour

We Did – Over the last few weeks we have seen an increase in reports of off-road motorbikes in Leicester Forest East. The beat team are working with neighbouring beats to identify the perpetrators and will be dealing with them appropriately. We have also seen an increase in anti-social behaviour and fly tipping across Glenfield and we are working Blaby District Council to identify those responsible.

You Said – Vehicle Crime

We Did – This issue continues to be prevalent in the area and as such we encourage residents to lock their cars and remove their belongings to help prevent the issue. Unfortunately, we have had reports of tools being taken from vans please review your van security and remove any high value tools.

You Said – Residential Burglary

We Did – Targeted patrols have taken place across the beat whilst also conducting enquiries after burglaries have taken place.

You Said – Road Safety

We Did – Since the half term break we have received calls from most our primary schools across the beat regarding parking. We know its always a rush on the school run but please be mindful about how and where you park. If cars are seen causing an obstruction or in a dangerous they are at risk of being recovered by police which the owner will incur costs. The county council also have their monitoring car out around the county.
