Police Report – January 2016

Crime Alert

Leicester Forest East, Kirby Muxloe and Glenfield all fall within an area subject to a current Police operation targeting offenders of burglaries and theft from motor vehicles. Dedicated patrols have been deployed at key times and locations, utilizing the local beat teams. This is in response to the number of those offences within this area. Your help is needed to help us catch those that steal your property. If you see anything that you find suspicious then please call us on 101. If you see an offence taking place use 999. Anti-Social Behaviour

In January we received 10 reports of anti-social behaviour.

A report of a noisy neighbour in The Keep, Kirby Muxloe is currently being monitored by the beat team. We are working with social housing and social services in relation to this issue. The community have highlighted other issues related to this and we are working to find the best outcome for the problem with our partner agencies.

Multiple reports have been received regarding youths in Glenfield, mostly around the COOP who are causing general ASB across the parish. These incidents are being investigated and are subject to a Problem Solving Plan the beat team have been working on. We have met with the COOP and the Youth Club next to it, which has resulted in closer working partnerships between us to identify perpetrators so that the few individuals among the youths frequenting the area are targeted by the Police and the District Council whilst allowing the other youths to continue to enjoy their free time. We are also dealing with an incident of criminal damage involving some of the youths, who have been identified through enquiries with partner agencies, local businesses, residents and some of the other youths in the area.

It is important to remember that not all groups of youths are doing anything wrong, most are just meeting their friends and having fun. Should a group be acting in a manner that is or could cause others to be harassed, alarmed or distressed, that is when their actions are unacceptable and we should be made aware of it so that their behaviour can be appropriately addressed. The public's help is needed with this by reporting anti-social behaviour so if anyone sees or hears any problems, please let us know.

Community Engagement

The beat team continue to work with the County and Parish Councils as well as Community Speed Watch in relation to speeding issues within the



three parishes. Speeding vehicles affect many locations and we know where there is a persistent problem. PCSO 6107 Wright and SPC 5364 Bradbury have issued one speeding ticket on Elmtree Avenue in Glenfield with 19 verbal warnings being given to drivers across the other locations that they conducted enforcement action on Saturday 30th January. Locations identified by members of the public and partner agencies will continue to be visited by the beat team assisted by the Special Constabulary and where appropriate tickets and warnings will be given to drivers. It is important to keep our roads as safe as possible and along with the many other duties we undertake we will continue to tackle this issue.

Beat officers visited the Hall School in Glenfield in January and had fun with the Nursery class there helping to teach them about road safety. The schools always work well with the Police, teaching our children to be safe near the roads goes a long way to keeping them safe whilst they are growing up. It's always a fun experience for all involved.
