The beat team were in the beat bus outside the shop Forest House Lane, Wardens Walk LFE and One Stop Kirby in January for local residents to come and meet a member of their beat and speak about any local issues. We'll be out again in February too:

What you told us:

- We have had numerous calls from Glenfield residents in relation to a female begging at people's doors. The Glenwatch page also provided us with further information in relation to these incidents.
- Anti-social Behaviour (ASB) from teenagers in the vicinity of St Andrews Church in LFE.

What we did:

- Collated all the information in relation to the female begging in Glenfield, identified an individual and made an arrest in relation to fraud offences which are currently under investigation. We are also pursuing the matter with Blaby District Council and a Housing Authority in relation to the ASB this is causing.
- We have attended an incident called into us and liaised with staff at the Kathleen Rutland Home as well as the staff on the Reality Youth Bus. We have arranged to visit the Youth Bus to speak with all the youths. This is a valuable service for many local youths of which a few need to be reminded about their behaviour when attending.

The term County Lines describes gangs and organized criminal networks involved in exporting illegal drugs into other areas of the country. They are likely to exploit children or vulnerable adults to move and store drugs and money and will often use coercion, intimidation, violence (including sexual violence) and weapons. Who is at risk and how can you help? Any child, young person or vulnerable person could be at risk of being criminally exploited by drugs or organized crime gangs. Everyone can help by learning the signs to look out for and being vigilant within their work and home environment.
