In your community...

On June the 8th, Police Sergeant Tim McKagan moved onto a new role within Leicestershire Police having been the supervisor for Leicester Forest East, Kirby Muxloe and Glenfield for nearly 3 years. When asked about his time covering this beat he said... "Working on a neighbourhood has been a wonderful experience which I will remember for the rest of my career. I'd like to express my sincere thanks for the continued superb working relationships forged between the local partnerships we have in place that enable us to deliver exceptional service to the local community."



His replacement will take up their post in July and will be covered by neighbouring beat sergeants until that time.

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)



In June we had reports of damage to the shelter on Forest East Park. Offensive graffiti has to be removed by the Parish Council. This is being done by local youths using the facilities. The Parish Council has already had to remove the tree house from Spider Park recently, it would be a shame to lose further youth provision due to mindless vandalism. If you have any information regarding this it would be gratefully received by the beat team. Station Park in Glenfield has also had reports of antisocial behaviour. Potential drug use having been reported to us. The beat team have spoken to the alleged perpetrators of this and will be monitoring the situation moving on into the summer holidays.

Kirby Muxloe Primary School also reported former pupils getting on site over the weekends.

With the summer holidays upon us it's important that parents reinforce the message of respect for the community to their children. Equally, it's important for everyone to remember that most of the time, children are not being anti-social, they are just playing. Engage with them before reporting them to us as they may not realise what they are doing is upsetting people.

Crime Prevention – Robbery/Personal Safety

ARE YOU AN EASY TARGET?



Whilst out and about, whether it be traveling to work, the shops or walking the dog, it’s important to be aware of your surroundings. Whilst the chances of being a victim of a robbery is low wherever you are, each of us can reduce this

chance by taking appropriate precautions against opportunist criminals:

- Keep valuables out of sight. This includes mobile phones, tablets and laptops. Don’t have your phone half in your back pocket and keep other, larger, similar goods in unassuming carry cases like a rucksack.
- Photograph all of your expensive jewellery and ensure you have any identifying marks and serial numbers of items you own.
- All your senses help you to detect potential dangers. Be vigilant if listening to music or using your mobile while on the move or when relaxing in a park or similar location.
- Keep handbags closed. Wear over the shoulder bags and have clasps that face inwards.
- Keep jewellery covered up.
- Be aware of your surroundings. If you feel unsafe, change your direction, go into a shop or go up to someone and start a conversation until any perceived danger has passed.
- Use well lit, busy streets and a route you are familiar with.
- Register your belongings with immobilise.com
