### Leicestershire Police Website has been revamped

The Leicestershire Police Website has undergone some significant changes. As part of these changes, it now allows members of the public to report incidents to us online. Most things can now be reported swiftly and effectively via this method which allows those who are not online or in urgent need of our assistance to get through to us via 999 and 101 quicker. The 'report' function directs you to contact us via 101 should you answer a question that cannot be dealt with via the online reporting system. Visit <https://www.leics.police.uk/> and click on the 'report' tab.

If you or another person are in immediate danger or a crime is currently taking place, always call 999.

### Prolific Offender from Glenfield area jailed.

A prolific offender who lives in and operates in the Glenfield area causing some Anti-Social Behaviour along with their criminal behaviour has recently been sentenced to three years in prison. This should have a significant impact on reducing the number of victims in the area for the foreseeable future!

### You told us about theft from motor vehicles in Glenfield

Since the beginning of the year there has been an increase in theft from motor vehicles in Glenfield. Following extensive investigations and proactive patrols 2 persons were arrested, charged and sentenced to spend time in prison. Since April the level of theft from motor vehicles has returned to similar levels experienced in the area for the time of year. The Dedicated Neighbourhood Team continues to monitor and take appropriate action whenever a spike in crime is detected. We also assist our investigation teams dealing with individual crimes where there are lines of enquiry that they need assistance with as and when they are reported to us.

It is important to report all offences to us so that we can build up a picture of when there is a crime spree in the area. This allows us to identify patterns in order to target offenders, catch them and prevent offences from continuing.

### You told us about drug dealing to children in Kirby Muxloe

This originated from a post on the Kirby Muxloe Notice Board on Facebook. Concerns of this kind should always be reported to us to take appropriate action, not just shared on Facebook. It is important to realise that concerns of this nature may not always be as reported. The alleged perpetrator has been spoken to with regards to this and words of advice about their perceived behaviour have been given. Intelligence has been submitted onto police systems and stop and search powers may be used should there be grounds to use them in relation to this. The investigation has now been closed.

### You told us about parking issues around Warren Lane Doctors and Kathleen Rutland Home

We have been made aware of pavement parking in the area of the Kathleen Rutland Home and have been proactive in the area to deal with any vehicles preventing use of the pavement for pedestrians. We will continue to patrol the area with regards to this.

We have also been made aware of parking around the doctors on Warren Lane and traffic issues around this. We are patrolling this area in relation to any obstructions, speeding and dangerous driving around this location and will be reporting back to the Parish Council.
