Highlighting Courier Fraud.

Officers investigating incidents of fraud have issued a warning to others after three elderly people in Leicester were targeted in the last week. Three incidents have been reported where victims have lost more than £27,000 as a result of offences commonly known as courier fraud. Courier fraud occurs when a fraudster contacts victim by telephone claiming to be a police officer or bank official. The caller sounds plausible and may confirm the victim's name and address, basic information which could be obtained easily. In some instances, after trust has been gained, the fraudster will claim the victim's bank account has had some fraudulent activity or that the caller is investigating counterfeit currency. They persuade them to go their local branch and take out a large sum of money from their account. The fraudsters then send someone to collect the money from the victim's home address.

Road Safety

Drivers are reminded to observe speed limits across the beat area. Roads particularly in residential areas have a 30 MPH speed limit. Where a School is present, a 20 MPH limit is often in force. Owing to complaints being made, Officers will be looking to carry out some speed enforcement operations over the next few months.

Parking on pavements continues to be a problem and all drivers should park fully on the road wherever possible. If parking on the pavement is unavoidable, space must be left to enable a Double Buggy or a Mobility Scooter to pass in safety.

ASB

During the month, a total of 7 incidents of Anti-Social Behaviour of various types have been reported to Police. This is a reduction on the figure for May 2023.

This week, 3-9 July 2023, is national ASB Awareness Week, a week of activity to bring together local communities and organisations, to increase their understanding of antisocial behaviour, who to report it to i.e. what are police and partner matters, and how to report it.

Throughout this week, our local neighbourhood teams will be taking part in community engagement events, beat surgeries and hotspot patrols in order to understand community concerns around ASB matters. Throughout the week we will be sharing good news stories on our Social Media Platforms using the #ASBAwarenessWeek hashtag.

Burglary

During the month of June, there have been a total of 6 incidents reported to Police across the whole of the beat area. These are broken down as 4 against residential properties, 1 against a commercial property and 1 against a residential property but unconnected building. These figures indicate a reduction on last months figures.

Vehicle Crime

During the month of June, there have been a total number of 14 incidents reported to Police across the whole of the beat
