



Our Policing Pledge

As part of Leicestershire Constabulary's commitment to delivering the Policing Pledge, we will:

- Provide you with details of your local neighbourhood policing teams.
- Ensure neighbourhood policing teams and other police patrols are visible on your patch at the times when they will be most effective.
- Respond within 24 hours to messages left for your neighbourhood policing team.
- Aim to be with you promptly (if attendance is required) if you call us about an issue which has been agreed as a neighbourhood priority.
- Hold monthly public meetings or surgeries, giving you an opportunity to meet your local policing team, tell them about issues that concern you and have your say.
- Make more information available about local crime and policing issues, including the provision of crime maps.

Our local Pledge to you is that during the next three months, we will tackle the following local priorities:

1. Speeding on Elm Tree Avenue, Glenfield, which is a problem at all times of the day and night.

It's been a busy and happy start to the New Year here at Blaby Local Policing Unit.

There have been some movements with the appointment of three Neighbourhood Sergeants who will have responsibility for the three geographical areas covered by Blaby LPU. These areas are the same as the County Council Community forums - North, Central and South. These Sergeants will have responsibility for the Neighbourhood Teams and will oversee the management of the Neighbourhoods.

In addition to this CID officers have arrived at Blaby Local Policing Unit so that they can work along side our Neighbourhood Teams to drive down crime and anti-social behaviour.

The Neighbourhood Problem Solving Plans are based on feedback from neighbourhood consultation questionnaires. We, Blaby District Council and the wider partnership will do all we can to help resolve these issue.

Neighbourhood update

Listed below are the priorities you told us about three months ago and how we tackled them:

You told us...

Vehicles speeding on Elm Tree Avenue, Glenfield, which is a problem at all times of the day and night, by enforcement and education, the use of warning letters when community volunteers take speed readings, and long term strategies to solve this problem.

We responded...

By targeting speeding drivers using Radarlux speed equipment which displays a vehicle's speed. As a result of this 13 advisory letters were sent to drivers who had been recorded speeding. This amounted to 19 per cent of all drivers monitored. The Neighbourhood Team have also issued one Fixed Penalty notice to a driver, adding three penalty points on their driving licence and a £60 fine. Community Speedwatch operated again during November and as a result of the hard work and dedication of the community volunteers, approximately 18 drivers were sent advisory letters from Leicestershire County Council. The Neighbourhood Team are working closely with the Parish Council to decide how best to tackle the issue in the longer term and hope to gain assistance from the County Council Highways Department as well. We hope to solve this problem through enforcement and education, the use of warning letters when community volunteers take speed readings, and other long term strategies.
