Damage to Business Premises on Baines Lane

Last month we updated you about the fact this was an ongoing issue at the location. Although proving the criminal damage offences will not be possible, the beat team have identified several individuals involved in Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) at the location. These individuals will be dealt with involving their parents and Blaby District Council's (BDC) ASB department.

Memorial Hall Car Park

We issued Section 59 Warning Notices to moped riders driving in a manner causing Anti-Social Behaviour at the location. Further such behaviour anywhere within the next year will result in their vehicles being seized.

School Visits

We had a visit to The Glenfield School, where we spoke to the Year 6 pupils about Anti-Social Behaviour ensuring they were aware of what it is and how they can avoid causing issues for others whilst enjoying themselves in their local area.

We also visited The Hall School in Glenfield and Castle Play Group in Kirby Muxloe where we spoke to the younger children about 'People Who Help Us'.

Beat Surgeries

Unfortunately the parents evening at Fossebrook Primary School was cancelled. We did however attend parents evening at Stafford Leys Primary School and spoke with several residents on a variety of issues answering their questions and providing advice. No issues of wider concern were reported.

Likewise, all beat surgeries have been cancelled until further notice in line with Government advice.

Community Volunteering

Given recent events, monitoring the Kirby Muxloe and Leicester Forest East Notice Boards as well as the Glenfield Page and Glenwatch group, it has been heartening to see the community coming together to ensure that those in need have been checked on and helped by the wider community.
