Positive Outcomes from Crime

An assault occurred on Dominion Road on the 5th May where two persons known to each other were involved. A suspect has been identified and enquiries are ongoing. A burglary in Glenfield (Elm Tree Avenue) and another in LFE (Hinckley Road) have had suspects identified and arrested or interviewed. Enquiries continue. A robbery on Dominion Road has had suspects identified who were known to the aggrieved arrested and bailed pending further enquiries being completed. A male has been arrested and charged for criminal damage to a building on Dominion Road. A prolific suspect for theft from stores has been identified for a number of those committed in LFE. Efforts continue to locate the individual. A significant amount of cannabis was intercepted at a UK port bound for an address in LFE with a street value estimated at £80,000.00. A person has been arrested and was remanded to court. A suspect has been identified for a report of assault on the park in Kirby Muxloe. Enquiries continue in relation to this.

Emerging Crime Trends

Theft from motor vehicles remain a substantial percentage of crimes committed in the last month. Various items have been targeted. Don't become a victim of this type of offence, remove ALL belongings from your vehicle including your loose change, leave your glove box open to show that there is nothing inside it. Ensure your car is locked. Many of the reported theft from motor vehicles were insecure! Bicycles remain hot property for criminals. Secure yours inside a solid secure structure, then secure them with durable locks and ensure that you have security marked them and taken note of all the unique marks your bike has. Lastly, make a note somewhere of your frame number (found on the underside of the bike where the pedals meet)!

<u>ASB</u>

An individual has reported he is receiving harassment from persons in Glenfield. We are working with partner agencies to resolve this issue and attempting to identify suspects.

A noise complaint was received from an address on Dominion Road. This has been referred to the relevant partner agency.

A report was made of drug taking around the Millenium Green. Officers attended and as previous months no evidence of drugs have been seen by the officers and it was what the caller perceived to be occurring.

Youths have been reported using an elderly residential complex gardens on Faire Road in Glenfield as a cut through to the shops and a youth has been cheeky to a resident upsetting them. Times have been highlighted when this is prevalent and targeted patrols are being carried out to deter this behavior and the youths are currently being tracked down by the beat team to be dealt with.

Youths have been identified as knocking on residents doors around Forest House Road in LFE and running away. Some of these youths are known to the beat team who will be visiting them in due course and efforts are being made to identify more members of the groups.

A report of stones being thrown by a group of local youths in Ellis Close, Glenfield was attended by officers with names being taken and a verbal warning being given to the youths. Their details have been recorded should they persist in causing an issue in the area further action will be taken.

<u>Issues highlighted to police over the month</u>

It has been reported that persons have been attending an address on Faire Road Glenfield and taking advantage of an elderly person there. We have details of those attending the address and are currently pursuing them and any potential crimes that may be being committed. We are also putting the elderly person in touch with relevant authorities to try and assist them in managing various issues. If you are in the Faire Road area please look out for any suspicious people in company with any elderly persons. This can be a problem in any area, we urge you all to keep an eye out for potentially vulnerable people on your street wherever you live and report anything to us that seems like it may be an issue, especially where people may be 'completing work on their behalf'.
