Crime Alert

Leicester Forest East service station continues to suffer from vehicle crime. at the location again targeting lorries parked overnight. Traffic Officers continue to patrol the area overnight and the beat team have arranged crime awareness events with the management to try and make drivers more aware of the problem which will start in June. Historically in the Spring and Summer months garden ornaments and plants are targeted by criminals. Take down any registration numbers and descriptions of any person that you see stopping briefly in the street and

Anti-Social Behaviour

An incident of road rage has been reported to us by Glenfield Parish Council. When driving although other road users actions may appear inconsiderate or even dangerous it is important to just carry on with your journey and not engage with the driver rather than have an argument. More often than not road rage incidents involve a criminal offence. Much better to avoid an escalation of poor driving to a criminal record. If you think there are any further issues like a potrential drunk driver then call 101 with your information.

Dog Fouling has been reported to have caused some issues across the beat this month too. It's quite simple, if your responsible enough to have a dog then you're responsible enough to clean up after it. Blaby District Council, the Parish Councils and the Police all work together to reduce this problem. Any information on anyone you see leaving dog mess behind would be warmly received by any of those organizations.

Whilst conducting Speed Enforcement Patrols this month as part of the beat teams effort to continuously tackle the problem, as well as the ten verbal warnings and a driver being issued with a Traffic Offence Report (which will be sent on for a ticket/speed awareness course/Report to Court), the beat team, assisted by the Special Constabulary also intercepted a vehicle in Glenfield that was involved in drug dealing. Unfortunately the persons in the car made good their escape but a large quantity of cannabis was recovered following a call from a resident after seeing the drugs being hidden nearby. Attempts to identify the suspects continue.

We have been visiting Oakwood School and engaging with the children there teaching them about the Police, Councils and other services and how to access them. These classes have been well received by the challenging children in the school which will hopefully allow them to help themselves out of many situations they may face in the future as well keep public services free for other jobs because they have the knowledge to help themselves.
