Positive Outcomes from Crime

On the 19th November, a resident of Glenfield noticed that an elderly neighbor was getting out a tradesman vehicle. They contacted the police as they had heard that rogue tradesmen had previously taken elderly and vulnerable victims to cashpoints to withdraw money to pay them. When police attended a person was arrested for trading standards offences. Trading standards are currently investigating the matter. This type of crime targets the most vulnerable people in the community and it is up to all of us to help protect them as the neighbor in this example has. The beat team have noticed that there have been more reports of this type of potential fraudulent criminality in Glenfield over the last month. In other circumstances by the time police arrived the tradesmen had left the location. Please be vigilant regarding this type of crime, do not open your doors to unexpected visitors, and please call 101 to report any suspicious activity. A suspect has been interviewed in relation to an assault at Leicester Forest East Rugby Club. The investigation is ongoing. Three persons have been arrested and bailed for enquiries to take place regarding the spike in theft from motor vehicles. Two people have been identified and charged with shop theft and another person has been identified for theft of petrol.



Emerging Crime Trends and Crime Prevention

Theft from motor vehicles is again an issue in Leicester Forest East. Many of these offences have been on the M1 service station, with lorry's being broken into overnight. Prevention advice to combat this is to remove all property from your vehicle and open and remove all property from your glove box. The beat team are working with the services in an attempt at combatting this issue.

Blaby Local Policing Unit had two incidents of burglary other than dwellings where archery kit was stolen from local clubs, including one in Leicester Forest East. If anyone has any information regarding the possible location of this equipment please get in touch with us.

During November, a report was received of someone trying to get into a vehicle as it was travelling slowly along Hinckley Road. This person was not found but we would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone to ensure that their vehicle is locked whilst driving to reduce the possibility of being hijacked. This type of offence is very rare, however, simply locking your doors makes it even more so.

Anti-Social Behavior

A moped was burnt out on the Bridge on Forest Drive in Kirby Muxloe toward the beginning of the month. This unfortunately could not be identified but was later recovered by the Council.

Spider Park on Kings Walk in Leicester Forest East has been subject to criminal damage and anti-social behavior again recently with people uprooting wooden bollards on the park and damaging the recently repaired tree house. Any help identifying the culprits for this damage would be welcomed as it is preventing children from using the equipment while the Parish Council has it repaired as well as costing the Parish Council to repair it.

A person has been identified in relation to the anti-social use of their moped. The beat team is currently attempting to make contact with them to issue them with a formal warning under road traffic legislation which will mean that if they are identified continuing with this behavior or any other anti-social behavior involving a vehicle then the offending vehicle will be seized.

We have received reports of nuisance parking on Stamford Street, Glenfield. This issue is being looked into and we are looking to work jointly with the Council to try and tackle this issue.

The beat team have just undertaken additional training in new ASB Legislation which allows both PC's and PCSO's to use new powers to tackle Anti Social Behavior.

Policing Update
