Crime Alert

In October we received 327 calls from members of the public relating to incidents across the three parishes. Burglaries continue to rise across all three parishes which is reflected across the force area. With the Christmas season fast approaching please be extra vigilant on your home security, don't leave Christmas presents on show underneath your Christmas tree's as opportunist offenders are common over this period.

In addition Theft from Vehicles has also increased again, don't make it easy for these desperate offenders and ensure you take all property out of your vehicles.

Anti-Social Behavior

We had 6 reports of ASB across the three parishes these are nothing off note. Glenfield continues to see a large youth presence coming over from Anstey to cause trouble around the village, mainly centered around the Youth club and Tesco on Dominion Road. The beat teams are currently working closely with the youth club and the Anstey beat team in order to target the youths who are causing the beat the most nuisance. Glenfield also continues to see sporadic arsons caused by persons setting light street furniture, we are currently working on trying to identify the offenders and would encourage anyone with any information to come forward and report it to 101.

Beat Initiatives

The beat team have been visiting the local primary schools to carry out Stranger Danger Talks to the pupils. Also having identified a large proportion of crime on the beat relating to shop theft the beat team have been visiting the local shops across the three parishes in order to conduct crime prevention talks to the employees. In response to the increase in Burglaries we have conducted targeted patrols in the area and have been



actively leafleting the areas that have experienced offences offering crime prevention advice.

House burgled in Kirby Muxloe

We are appealing for public help after two cars were stolen on separate days from the same house in Kirby Muxloe.

Burglars broke into a house on Desford Road near to the junction with Ratby Lane sometime between Thursday 22 October and Friday 23 October.

A black Fiat 500, an Apple Mac computer and a Playstation 4 games console were all stolen. The Fiat was later found abandoned on Scudamore Road, Leicester on Saturday 31 October.

On Saturday 31 October, a second vehicle, a black Vauxhall Corsa registration number FN59 KVT was stolen from the same house.

We are particularly keen to speak to a man who was seen in the area around 1.15pm on Friday 23 October. He is described as white, aged in his 20's, of slim build, about 6ft tall with mousey coloured hair.

Detective Constable 2892 James Collins, who is investigating the incident, said: "We suspect that the house was targeted by the same people and I would like to appeal to anyone who has been offered a vehicle or property like the ones detailed above in suspicious circumstances to get in touch.
