What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following in December 2023.

Priority 1: Road Safety

You said: That Road Safety issues are your number 1 concern.

What we are going to do: *Speed Enforcement Patrols *Partnership Working *Issue Traffic Offence Reports (TORs)

Priority 2: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

You Said: Anti-Social Behaviour including use of motorbikes on open spaces was an issue to you.

What we are going to do: *Targetted Patrols *Educational Events *Partnership Working

Priority 3: Burglaries

You Said: That burglaries around this time of year was an issue.

What we are going to do: *Targetted Patrols *Partnership Working

What we are doing

Priority 1 Road Safety:

- Conducting Speeding Enforcement when the issue is most prevalent, sporadically but regularly across the beat.
- Issue Traffic Offence Reports (TORs) for offences.
- Utilising beat surgeries to educate members of the public as to road safety and to encourage the reporting of such behaviour which is contrary to this.
- Conducting high visibility patrols of hotspot areas to deter further offences from occurring.

Priority 2 Antisocial Behaviour (ASB):

- Patrols of Parks and other recreational and business areas where ASB is being reported to be occurring.
- We have been engaging with local youths discouraging them from becoming involved in such behaviour.

Priority 3 Burglaries:

- Targetted patrols of the beat area to deter burglaries from occurring.
- Giving out crime prevention advice to members of the public.

News

Christmas is approaching fast and soon it will be upon us. The weather is getting colder and road conditions are becoming more dangerous.

If you are driving please leave more time for your journey and remember that stopping distances will increase in rainy, snowy and icy conditions.

At this time of year people sometimes leave their cars running on their driveway to defrost in the mornings. Thieves can quite easily steal these vehicles when they are left like this. I would like to encourage members of the public not to leave their vehicle running unattended.

Please remember to lock doors and windows when you go out, utilise faraday bags for vehicle keys for vehicles which have keyless entry, use burglar alarms if you have them and make sure valuables are kept out of sight if possible.

We want to encourage as many people as possible to sign up to our community messaging system, Neighbourhood Link. You will receive regular emails keeping you up to date about local policing issues, good news stories, crime prevention advice, witness appeals and local events.
