Vehicle Crime in Glenfield

We have targeted our patrols at known locations where vans have been broken into and given out crime prevention packs to hotels to hand to van drivers. We also spoke with van drivers at various locations and handed out crime prevention packs. Standard crime prevention on this matter can be found below.

Inconsiderate Parking around The Hall School

In particular, Waring Close has been highlighted by the school and local business'. We are in the process of arranging a meeting with Blaby District Council in relation to this to see what action can be taken as the constant poor parking by a few parents is causing obstructions to care facilities which could prove to have profound consequences for those who may be in need of medical attention. We would encourage all parents to refrain from parking on Waring Close as it is a private road, park sensibly on Glenfield Frith Drive and walk the extra hundred metres like most of the parents who drop their children off.

Vehicle Crime

Vehicle crime is unfortunately a constant blight in our communities. Unfortunately a large percentage of vehicle crime occurs because opportunists are being given an easy time by members of the public not locking their vehicles.

Here are a few further tips to consider when thinking about vehicle security:

- Leave it on show expect it to go. Always remove valuables from your vehicle
- Remove Satnavs including cradles and their sucker marks
- Don't leave tools in vans overnight
- If you have a garage use it
- If you have a catalytic convertor then consider a metal cage or getting it etched
